## **Beispiel Hauptteil:**

To start off, attitudes regarding the future of cars are different, even among the coalition parties. However, all agree that diesel- and gasoline powered cars need to go. Center-right parties such as the FDP are open to any kind of environmentally-friendly technology. Left-leaning parties such as the SPD and The Green Party focus on promoting electric cars.

While all parties want to incentivize (Anreiz schaffen) the use of electric cars, they have different ideas on how to do so: The FDP wants to expand "emission trading": The idea of having to pay according to the amount of emissions caused, therefore making it worthwhile for companies to reduce emissions. The Green Party on the other hand wants to continue subsidizing the purchase of electric cars.

The left-leaning parties of the coalition also want to put a speed limit in place – they want drivers to go no faster than 130 km/h (80 mph) on freeways. The FDP however has other plans.

Lastly, The Green Party and the SPD want to expand public transportation and cycle tracks. The Green Party in particular also wants to halt the construction of new roads.
